Por your shooting enjoyment and to make you a better hunter, the Game Commission maintains public shooting ranges across the state. Those who shoot firearms at the Pennsylvania Game Commission's state game lands public shooting ranges must possess and carry with them either an annual \$31.97 range use permit or a current Pennsylvania general hunting or furtaker license. Individuals without a range use permit or hunting or furtaker license may be fined. Each licensed hunter or range permit holder may have one guest.

Range Regulations

Before you visit, please review the **Shooting Range Regula**tions and Prohibited ActsOpens In A New Window.

Each licensed hunter or range permit holder may have one guest. Unless otherwise posted, ranges are open year-round, from 8 a.m. until sunset, Monday through Saturday, and noon to sunset on Sundays. See the exception for Scotia Range below. Please contact the appropriate Region Office to check the daily status of ranges you wish to visit.

Shooters should show consideration for others waiting for an open bench. It is common, especially leading up to the bear and deer seasons, to find an adult teaching a youngster how to shoot, or to find someone having difficulty sighting-in a rifle. Please be patient in such circumstances, and if it seems appropriate, offer assistance. Anyone under the age of 16 must be accompanied by someone 18 or older.

Do not collect the brass of shooters while the range is active. Range permits and hunting or furtaker licenses do not need to be displayed while using a state game lands public shooting range, but must be in possession, as well as a secondary form of identification.

This article I got off the Game Commission's website, the reason I am putting it in the paper is because I had a few calls a few month's back that had hunting camps in Upstate Pennsylvania and they weren't from a range that was owned and operated by the Game Commission and were not sure of the rules of using the state owned ranges. I hope this is helpful.

WATER & ICE SAFETY

Almost everyone knows how enjoyable time on the water can be. Don't let a moment of carelessness ruin your fun. An inadvertent fall in the water can be an amusing story afterwards, or it can result in tragedy — ALWAYS wear a life jacket when you are on, in, or near water. Follow the tips and links on this page for important safety information.

PADDLERS - CANOES AND KAYAKS

Paddling sports are very popular recreational water sports in Pennsylvania. There are dangers that can be lessened with knowledge, preparation and practice. Primary hazards are capsizing, swamping or just falling out of the boat. Keep in mind that paddling is a "get wet" sport.

PADDLING TIPS

(1) Wear your life jacket. Some 80 percent of all recreational boating fatalities happen to people who are not wearing a life (2) Expect to get wet and dress properly. Even the best paddlers sometimes capsize or swamp their boats. Be prepared to swim. If the water looks too hazardous to swim (4) If you capsize, hold on to your boat, in, don't go paddling. unless it presents a life-threatening situation. (5) Scout ahead whenever possible. Know the river. Avoid surprises. prepared for the weather. Get a forecast before you go. Wear wading shoes or tennis shoes with wool, polypropylene,

Boating safety increases with numbers. (10) Keep painter lines (ropes tied to the bow) and any other ropes coiled and secured. (11) Never tie a rope to yourself or to another paddler, es-(12) Kneel to increase pecially a child. your stability before entering rougher wa-(13) If you collide with ter, like a rapid. an obstruction, lean toward it. a float plan with a reliable person, indicating where you are going and when you will return. Remember to contact the person when you have returned safely.

Police find live deer in trunk of car during traffic stop

Police officers in York County, Pennsylvatrunk during a traffic stop Newberry Township Police Department Police in Pennsylvania found something unexpected inside a match of the year.
