Rules – Learn and Follow

hanks to Board Chairman Gene Sullivan and L to all who served on and advised the Rules Revision Committee. Lots of research and long hours went into updating, revising and consolidating our Association Range and general rules. I asked 6. Members are responsible for supervision of Pat to publish the General Rules this month and the Range Specific Rules next month. The new rules are in effect immediately.

Speaking of rules, please be on the look-out for our most violated rules. If you render a target frame 7. Non-member match participants who have unusable, vou owe the association \$10 and vou may take home the broken pieces. As a member of HF&GPA, you are required to call attention to 8. All members must display Association I.D. any rule infractions you witness. Without further ado:

HOLMESBURG FISH & GAME PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION

GENERAL RULES Applicable to all Association Ranges and Facilities

Il Association rules are to be construed in furtherance of safety, uniformity and legality. The discharge of firearms on Association ranges is prohibited except in conformity with these rules.

- 1. All members and guests are required to read and comply with all rules and are obligated to call attention to rule violations and seek compliance.
- 2. All new members must complete and pass the Association Orientation Course before using any Association ranges.
- 3. New members may be required to complete and pass a HF&G firearm training course as a condition of membership.

- 4. All members, guests and visitors must sign in before using any ranges or facilities and must sign out before leaving the premises.
- 5. Members are allowed no more than 2 guests per day. Fees per guest, as set by the Board of Directors, are to be paid to a Range Officer or Association Executive. A member's spouse and children under the age of 18 are exempt from guest fees.
- their guests and guests must be in the company of the member at all times. Guests must use the same shooting bench with the host member.
- paid a match fee are exempt from paying a guest fee for the rest of the match day.
- Badges when on the premises.
- 9. Carrying concealed or holstered firearms is prohibited on Association premises.
- 10. No person under the influence of or impaired by alcohol or any drug, legal or illegal, may engage in any shooting activity. Alcohol is not permitted on Association premises unless pre-approved by the Board of Directors.
- 11. All firearms must be cased and unloaded while being transported to and from the ranges.
- 12. Shooters carrying firearms from the preparation area behind the Yellow Safety Line to and from a firing line must have all firearms in "Made Safe" condition (Page 6 Appendix

General Rules

- straight up.
- 13. All persons on Association ranges must use eye and ear protection.
- 14. All firearms must be in safe operating condition. Shooters using Association ranges are deemed to have consented to a 30. Smoking Prohibited: On the firing line all ranges, Indoor Range safety inspection of their firearms and ammunition by a Range Officer or Association Executive.
- 15. All firearms must be in completely MADE SAFE condition, prohibited. except when being fired in accordance with these rules. Refer to page 6 Appendix "A" Firearms Made Safe Procedures.
- 16. Shooters must use wooden target frames provided by the Association or personal frames purchased from the Association 33. Exceptions to any range or Association rules may be allowed or constructed to the specification provided on the Association website.
- 17. Approved Paper Targets: Silhouette, bullseye, sighting-in, animal, and blank paper sheets. Prohibited Targets: Any target that contains a human photo or human likeness.
- 18. Pistols chambered for rifle cartridges must be fired on the 19. Rifles that are chambered for pistol cartridges may be used on the rifle or outdoor pistol range.
- 20. All shots fired on any single-projectile range must be aimed at a target directly in front of the shooter's position: crossfiring is prohibited.
- vertical position or an angle that would allow a bullet to strike of or damage to personal items on Association grounds. above or below the backstop area. Barrels must be parallel with the ground when shooting. Shooters failing to keep shots within the impact area must cease shooting and correct the cause of such failure.
- 22. Single-projectile firearms may be loaded with no more than 5 rounds, M-1 Garand rifles 8 rounds. Shooters wishing to load more than 5 rounds for test purposes may request permission for such testing from a Range Officer or Association Executive. Such permission is valid for that shooting session only
- 23. NO Rapid Fire. Allow at least 2 seconds between shots.
- 24. Shooters who fail to consistently and appropriately control their firearm must cease their shooting activity and notify a Range Officer or Association Executive of the difficulty and request assistance or instruction.
- 25. Firing armor piercing, tracer or incendiary ammunition is pro
- 26. Drawing from a holster is prohibited.
- 27. Association members utilizing Class III/Title II firearms; Full-Auto firearms, suppressors or short barreled rifles (SBRs) must be in possession of all appropriate documentation. For any Full-Auto firearms shooters must secure permission from a Range Officer, Association Executive or other shooters on the firing line.
- 28. Firearms utilizing a Binary Trigger System must have the se-

- lector switch on semi-auto. Firing in the binary position is strictly PROHIBITED.
- "A" Firearms Made Safe Procedures) with muzzles pointed 29. Under no circumstances shall any person shoot at, injure or otherwise harass any wildlife on Association premises. Accidental killing of wildlife is to be promptly reported to a Range Officer, Association Executive or the Pennsylvania Game Commission.

 - 32. All members and guests are required to pick up and dispose of their brass, hulls, trash and place them in the proper disposal containers. Target frames must be returned to their proper storage location.

 - 34. Range Officers and Association Executives have the authority to remove any member or guest from any range or facility for any rule infraction. No arguments will be tolerated.

Violation of any Association rules may be referred to the Board of Directors for corrective action which may include suspension of range privileges or expulsion from the Association.

Members may petition the Board of Directors to consider any grievance arising from actions of Range Officers or Association Executives but they must comply with the ruling at the time of the incident. The decision of the Board of Directors shall be final.

APPENDIX

Procedures applicable to all Association Ranges A. FIREARMS MADE SAFE PROCEDURES Rifles – Pistols – Shotguns - Single Projectile Firearms

(FOR USE ON ASSOCIATION SINGLE-PROJECTILE RANGES MEANING RIFLE, PISTOL AND INDOOR RANGE)

- A. Rifles and shotguns used as rifles: magazine out, tubular magazine empty, action open, Empty Chamber Indicator (ECI) inserted in breech end of barrel, muzzle pointed down range.
- B. Semi-automatic pistols: magazine out, action open, ECI inserted in breech end of barrel, muzzle pointed down range.
- C. Double action revolvers: cylinder open, ECI inserted in breech end of barrel, muzzle pointed down range.
- D. Single action revolvers: loading gate open, all chambers empty, ECI inserted through the chamber, muzzle pointed down range.

- E. Hinged or break open firearms: action open, ECI inserted in breech end of barrel, muzzles pointed in a safe direction.
- F. Black Powder: Completely unloaded, no powder, ball or primer of any kind in the firearm.

B. CEASE FIRE (NON-EMER-GENCY) PROCEDURES

Single-Projectile Ranges are in Commence Fire Status until a Cease Fire is called.

To call a Cease Fire, a shooter needs to gain consent from other shooters on the firing line. When agreed, all firearms must be MADE SAFE as per Appendix "A" above. All persons must move behind the Yellow Safety line and remain behind the Yellow Safety line until there is an audible signal (bell or buzzer) and the Red Safety light is activated. Only then may anyone advance beyond the Red Firing line and down range to tend targets. Under NO circumstances will be any firearms or accessories be touched or handled while the range is in Cease Fire status.

C. COMMENCE FIRE PROCEDURES

A range Cease Fire status is ended only by following these Commence Fire procedures.

A commence fire announcement can be awar made only after: 1) all persons have diffic returned from down range, 2) they have again moved behind the Yellow Safety this is line, 3) a visual inspection confirms that no one is down range. The audible signal (bell or buzzer) must be sounded followed by the Red Safety light turned off. The range is then in Commence Fire Status.

D. EMERGENCY CEASE FIRE PROCEDURES

In the event that a person or animal is observed down-range in a position of danger, any person observing the endangered person or animal must immediately call the range to cease fire status by voice command "CEASE FIRE". When such voice command is heard, all shooting must immediately

cease, with not one more shot being fired. All firearms are to be immediately made completely safe, black powder rifles muzzles pointed straight up, ramrod inserted muzzle end of barrel, black powder pistols placed on a handgun loading stand. Then all persons are to move behind the Yellow Safety line pending further instructions.

As you can see, I have put page 1 & 2 of the General Rules plus page 6 that is the Appendix. Next week I will have Indoor Range, Outdoor Pistol Range, Outdoor Rifle Range, Shotgun Range, Archery, and Black Powder Specific Rules. A copy of these General Rules, and Specific Rules are on the Clubs Web Site.
